Readthroughs and Auditions are open to everyone from Year 11 students and older. We will only invite other members of the youth group to join the chorus following auditions when we know how many chorus spaces are available, this will be confirmed after October half-term.

Show Dates

12th, 13th, 14th, 19th, 20th and 21st January 2024 (2 shows each Saturday)

Cast:

Prince Frederick (F/M) – Principal Boy – Usually played by a female. Gorgeous and charming, but a little arrogant and immature. Wants life to be fun, with no responsibilities but his parents have other ideas! Luckily, he is about to meet someone who will change everything. Needs to be a confident singer.

Rapunzel (F) – Principal Girl – She's been locked in the tower her whole life but while she may be naïve, she is studious and clever from years of reading books. Needs to be a confident singer.

Dame Beatrix (Trixie) Bouffant (M) – A traditional panto dame. A poor but glamourous hairdresser, trying to earn and honest living. Mother of Rapunzel, who was snatched away as a baby. Also the mother of Frankie.

Frankie (M) – Valet to the prince and Dame Trixie's son (Rapunzel's brother). Big part that needs to build a good rapport with the audience. Some singing involved.

Witch Gothel (F) – The 'Baddie' – the evil witch who stole Rapunzel from her mother. Needs to be able to work the audience and encourage the boos and hisses. Some physical activity needed. One song.

Fairy Flora (F) – The good fairy...she has only just completed her training – this is her first job. Sweet, with a touch of comedy. All of her lines are in rhyme.

Curly & Bob (M/F) – The 'Comedy Duo'. Dim-witted henchmen to Witch Gothel. Both are bungling idiots – good comedy talent needed, including physical comedy.

King Geoffrey (M) – Worried that his son is irresponsible heir to the throne. Assertive and regal but with some comedy moments.

Queen Gertrude (F) – Prince Frederick's mother - she spoils her son and thinks the King is too hard on him.

Captain of the Guard (M) – Serious and authoritative, but often the target of dame Trixie's advances,

Lacie, Macie and Gracie (F) – Prince Frederick's social secretaries. They follow him around, hanging on to his every word, although Gracie may actually have her eyes on his valet! Singing required as these 3 will lead some of the chorus numbers.

Chorus – Chorus members will be required for villagers and palace courtiers as well as some other minor roles.

Plot:

Unable to sleep, Elaine Wheeler paces the living room of her Manhattan townhouse, troubled by unsettling memories and vague fears. Her husband tries to comfort her, but when he steps away for a moment, Elaine screams as she sees (or believes she sees) the body of a dead man in the window across the way. The police are called but find nothing except an empty chair. Elaine's terror grows as shortly thereafter she sees another body—this time a woman's—but by now the police are sceptical and pay no heed to her frantic pleas. Her husband, claiming that Elaine may be on the verge of a breakdown, calls in a lady psychiatrist, who agrees with his suggestion that Elaine should commit herself to a sanatorium for treatment. From this point on, the plot moves quickly and grippingly as those involved—Elaine's old friend and house guest Blanche; the inquisitive and rather sinister man who lives next door; and the nosy German maid Helga—all contribute to the deepening suspense and mystery of the play as it draws towards its riveting and chilling climax.

Cast of Characters:

(all ages are irrelevant, but some cast should be of a similar age, e.g. Elaine, Blanche and John)

Although the play is set in Manhattan, not all accents need to be American. Elaine and John, for example, could be British Expatriates. For those characters marked with an asterisk, an accent would be preferred.

If accents prove to be a problem, the play can be set in England, but a lot of references would have to be changed. Helga would still need to have a German lilt

Elaine Wheeler – Protagonist, emotionally unstable, feels betrayed

Blanche Cooke – Elaine's best friend, nurse, efficient, tailored

Helga* – Wheelers' German maid, suspicious

Jessica Appleby* – Busybody neighbour, amateur sleuth

Dr Tracey Lake* – Noted psychologist, professional

John Wheeler – Elaine's husband, stocks and bonds broker, he's all business

Lt. Walker* – Homicide detective, has no time for crazy women

Vanelli* – Italian Brooklyn patrolman, has an eye for art

Sam Hoke* – Owner of local deli, working class, murder is hurting his business


This is a cracking play and will have the audience guessing - right up to the final line
